

# Information of the 13th International Conference on Northeast Asian Natural Gas and Pipeline

September 3rd – 4th, 2013  
“Wangjiang Hotel” , Chengdu, China

## 1. Objectives

- In response to the influence of US shale gas revolution, Fukushima nuclear accident in Japan and thick smog over China, Northeast Asian countries which have successively seen government transition or parliamentary elections since 2012, have launched energy policies and natural gas development plans in favor of natural gas development and utilization, infrastructure construction and management.
- With the increasing development of conventional and the rise of unconventional natural gas, as well as expansion of gas infrastructure, natural gas / LNG supply in Northeast Asia is expected to be more diversified, gas/LNG utilization will be promoted.
- In the circumstances, the 13th International Conference on Northeast Asian Natural Gas and Pipeline will be held in Chengdu, China during September 3rd - 4th, 2013. The Northeast Asian Gas & Pipeline Forum (NAGPF) and Asia Gas and Pipeline Cooperation Research Center of China (AGPRCC) will organize this conference in collaboration with Asian Pipeline Research Society of the Russian Federation, Korea Pan-Asian Natural Gas & Pipeline Association, Northeast Asian Gas and Pipeline Forum of Japan and Petroleum Authority of Mongolia.
- The subject of the conference is Multilateral Win-win Cooperation Mechanism for Natural Gas and Pipeline in Northeast Asia. The basic goal of the conference is to contribute to the enhancement of natural gas utilization and the promotion of the Northeast Asian natural gas infrastructure network, to exchange individual information among the people concerned and to deepen mutual understanding.
- The Northeast Asian Gas and Pipeline Forum (NAGPF), a nonprofit organization (NPO) which consists of five member countries including Russia, China, Korea, Mongolia and Japan established in 1997 has worked for the purpose of natural gas development and increase of natural gas utilization. NAGPF has organized international conferences and conducted international joint researches in order to popularize the importance of natural gas development and utilization in Northeast Asia.
